HISTORIC FACTS

Cheviot was named after the boundary hills between England and Scotland, “The Cheviot Hills.” The town was founded in 1818 – incorporated in 1901 – became a city in 1932. In 1863, when Confederate General, John Hunt Morgan, led his Raiders through Union lines, one of his targets was Cheviot. The town was devastated by fire and destruction by Morgan’s Raiders on July 13 of that year.



CHEVIOT’S ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT PRECEDES CHEVIOT!

In 1814, Scottish immigrant, John Craig, built an INN and TAVERN on Harrison Pike. In 1818, he laid out a village in the area; called it CHEVIOT; sold lots and the town began. Interestingly, four years before there was a “CHEVIOT”, there was an “ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT” on this spot.

CHEVIOT BUSINESS DISTRICT IS ON THE MOVE!

*CHEVIOT boasts a very diverse niche Business District, with a **high occupancy rate**. Several new businesses are in the works, and the City is actively pursuing more.*

COMING IMPROVEMENTS

Already Planned and Funded Include:

1. GLENMORE AVENUE (FROM HARRISON AVENUE TO THE SOUTH CORPORATION LINE) IS GOING TO BE RECONSTRUCTED THROUGH THE "STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM" AND A "COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT".
2. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FOR \$20,000 TO MOVE FURTHER WITH THE "STREETScape PROGRAM"..
3. THE GIRL SCOUTS ARE WORKING ON A PROJECT FOR A "GATEWAY TO THE CITY."



The City of Cheviot is working to secure a GRANT to create a STREETScape for our Business District. We are currently seeking Design Proposal Ideas to incorporate elements such as DECORATIVE SIDEWALKS, CROSSWALKS, better LIGHTING, STREET FURNITURE, DECORATIVE STREET SIGNAGE etc.



Cheviot created a CRA (COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA) PROGRAM in 2007, which provides a potential Tax Reduction for Business Owners who improve their properties.



A new SIGN ORDINANCE was put into effect in 2007 to eliminate sign clutter, abandoned and "off premise" signs, in order to provide a cleaner, more unified appearance for the Business District.

WHAT'S NEW IN THE RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT?

In an effort to protect and increase PROPERTY VALUES, while insuring a BETTER QUALITY OF LIFE in our community, Cheviot has been aggressive, and in the forefront of adopting legislation to stem neglect of problem properties.

In the past few years Cheviot has adopted or strengthened Ordinances such as:

These new and updated Codes and Ordinances are working!
Dozens of derelict properties have been cleaned up and more are in the process!

Cheviot also has our own **HOUSING COURT** and access to programs in place to aid local residents who are having trouble properly maintaining their property.



CHEVIOT'S "\$1 HOUSES" PROGRAM

In an effort to promote more OWNER OCCUPIED HOMES, the City is buying Foreclosed Homes for \$1 from the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development and rehabbing them through a public-private partnership in which local businesses loan rehab money, give discounts for supplies and donate labor, while experienced City Workers do repairs with the help of local Banks and Businesses.

While, this program is still in its infancy stage, we plan to sell these homes and offer SPECIAL INCENTIVES to homeowners who want to put down roots in Cheviot.
