## 2015 Statistics


In 2015 the Cheviot Fire Division responded to 458 fire runs. The total fire loss was estimated to be \$43,900.00

The Cheviot Division of EMS responded to 1198 emergency medical calls. Revenue generated from EMS billing for 2015 was approximately \$150,000.00.

Combined runs were 166 runs over last year.

The Cheviot Training Division logged 1080 hours of training with local area departments.

The Cheviot Fire Prevention and Education Division conducted 215 fire inspections, installed 70 car seats, held 36 prevention activities and issued 12 new business permits.

**Division of Fire Monthly Report**  
January 2016

Members of Council,

In the month of January, the Fire Department made 77 EMS runs and 22 Fire runs. Our personnel trained 96 hours during the same time frame, installed 4 car seats, inspected 9 businesses, and held 3 fire prevention activities.

The Fire Department maintains all of our own vehicles and equipment. Weekly checks are done on all vehicles, breathing apparatus, saws, smoke ejectors, and extrication equipment. Daily checks are done on both squads, and fire apparatus. The personnel clean and disinfect the firehouse daily. The fire department also maintains the fuel log for city hall and measures the fuel levels several times a month.

We have just renewed our Drug and CLIA Licenses. Capt. Scherpenberg is in a Fire Officer Training class and several others are in refresher courses. Engineer Lakeberg has been off track with a torn meniscus in his knee (not work related). He will return by the end of the month.

The Fire Department has a new Medical Director Dr. Edward Morriss. He has volunteered in place of Dr. Howard Bialick. We have been fortunate enough through the years have these doctors do this service free of charge, they review our runs, protocols, and sign off on our drug license.

We have received a \$3,500.00 grant from the State Division of EMS that will be used to replace outdated AEDs in one of the support units, and in the engine. We also received an additional \$300.00 in January for narcans from the State.
