Meeting was called to order at 7:30PM by President Slaughter with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silent prayer. Roll was called and the following were found to be in attendance:

Motion to approve the minutes from the April 7 meeting was made by Mr. Dinkelacker, seconded by Mrs. Richter and carried with a 7-0 voice vote.

Adam Lynch addressed council with a presentation and slide show on the topic of bicycling as an alternative to other modes of transportation in the neighborhood. He's proposing a "Slow Ride" to engage local riders. Details to follow.

Resolution 15-9 To Authorize The Safety-Service Director To Donate Unneeded Audio-Visual Equipment To The Cincinnati Public Schools; And To Declare An Emergency. Introduced by Mrs. Richter, second by Mr. Martin. Adopted with a 7-0 voice vote.

Resolution 15-10 To Authorize The Safety-Service Director To Seek Bids For The Supply Of Ice Control Salt Through A Joint Bid With The City Of Cincinnati; And To Declare An Emergency. Introduced by Mr. Clark, second by Mrs. Richter. Adopted with a 7-0 voice vote.

Mrs. Roden read into record her report from the 4/14 meeting of the Buildings and Annexation Committee. Motion to receive and file made by Mrs. Roden, second by Mrs. Richter, 7-0 voice vote.

Mr. Clark read into record his report from the 3/24 meeting of the Parks & Playgrounds Committee. Received and filed with a motion by Mr. Clark, second by Mrs. Roden and a 7-0 voice vote.

Mayor's Report: Mayor Keller offered condolences to the Clark family in the passing of Bill's mother. / He announced that his Administrator, Theresa Sunderhaus is leaving to embark on a new career in nursing. He publicly thanked Theresa for her years of service, and announced her replacement, Harriet Green, who will be taking over at the beginning of May. / The issues surrounding a certain property on Delmar Ave. will be addressed tomorrow (4/22).

Safety-Service Director's Report: Mr. Braun stated that Home Depot will be finishing up the Pioneer Project in the next week. / Pool repair bids are due back next week, Robb Ave is progressing, Integrys (our aggregation supplier) has been purchased by Constellation Energy.

Law Director: Vitor's sign has been removed from the City-owned Morebattle property.

Irene Vitralakis gave council an update on the Cuffs & Ladders fundraiser for the police and fire departments, which will be taking place this Saturday at the Cheviot Eagles hall.

There was a motion made by Mrs. Zech to receive and file the Treasurer's reports from both January and February. Motion was seconded by Mrs. Richter, and carried with a 7-0 voice vote.


