

**November 18, 2014**  
**Minutes of City Council, Cheviot, Ohio**

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Meeting was called to order at 7:30PM by President Slaughter with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silent prayer. Roll was called and the following were found to be in attendance:

Tracy Winkler attended the meeting to administer the oath of office to new Council At Large member Leslie Roden, after which roll was called again. All of the above were in attendance, as well as Mrs. Roden.

Minutes from the October 21 meeting were approved with a motion by Mr. Martin, a second by Mrs. Richter and a 7-0 voice vote.

Ray Kroner, owner of Kroner's Dry Cleaners approached council to discuss the possibility of him leasing the 2 parking meters in front of his business to allow his customers free parking during the month of December. Following much discussion, it was determined that instead of leasing the meters, perhaps he could keep a bowl of quarters on the counter at the front of the business and allow customers to take one as reimbursement for their meter fee.

Mr. Satolli Glassmeyer addressed council regarding video production that his company does for towns like ours. After providing a breakdown of the costs involved, he was referred to Economic Developer Statkus.

Mr. Clark read minutes of the 10/28 meeting of the Streets, Lights and Sidewalks Committee, held to discuss parking meters. There was a motion to receive and file the report made by Mr. Clark, and a unanimous voice vote.

Resolution 14-26. To Transfer Funds; And To Declare An Emergency. Introduced by Mr. Dinkelacker, seconded by Mrs. Richter. Passed with a 7-0 voice vote.

Resolution 14-27 To Approve The Terms Of The Green Township/City of Cheviot Joint Economic Development District IV Earnings Tax Provisions; To Appoint The Safety-Service Director To The Board Of Directors For the Joint Economic Development District; And To Declare An Emergency. Introduced by Mrs. Zech, seconded by Mrs. Richter. Passed with a 7-0 voice vote.

Safety Service Report: Pioneer Park completion has been delayed till spring. Robb Ave project delayed due to weather. Working on 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter appropriations. Needs to be passed at the December meeting. Dedication of the nativity scene in front of AutoZone will be held on Sunday, November 30 at 6:30PM.

Law Director: Food truck ordinance is nearing completion. A draft is available for review. The small claims case against the city for damage done to a door during a resident wellness check was dismissed. There is a new Supreme Court ruling concerning probable cause in the issuance of warrants. Mark has a checklist of the criteria that must be met to determine probable cause. He will be presenting this to the police dept. this weekend.

Treasurer's Receipts for September 2014 are received and filed, via a motion by Mrs. Zech, a second by Mr. Sunderhaus and a unanimous voice vote.

Mayor's Court Receipts for October 2014 September are received and filed, via a motion by Mrs. Zech, a second by Mr. Clark and a unanimous voice vote.

Other business: President Slaughter has a copy of the new committee assignments which she will email to all of council.

Correspondence: 3 property maintenance violations. OKI is requesting information on Cheviot's representative for 2015. This will be discussed at the December 2 meeting.


