Re: Police Department Activity Report

During January of 2015, our Police Department activity included:

- Five (5) Felony arrests, including:
 - A subject was arrested for stealing tools from a shed, following an investigation;
 - A subject was arrested for attempting to steal from a closed business *; and
 - A subject was arrested beating up and robbing a subject of his wallet and cell phone in an apartment building hallway.
- Twenty-six (26) Misdemeanor arrests, which included:
 - Several arrests for drug possession; and
 - Multiple subjects arrested for Magistrate Court warrants.
- Twenty-six (26) Traffic charges, including:
 - Eight (8) arrests for Driving Under Suspension; and
 - Nine (7) cited for Speeding.
- Twenty-two (22) arrests of subjects who had outstanding warrants from other Jurisdictions.

Cases of note (*):

- The subject who stole tools from the shed was observed by a witness. His identity was unknown at the time of the report, but Officer Uhl was able to identify him with the help of that witness.
- A subject attempted to hide above the drop ceiling of a business and wait until everyone had left. However, he fell through the ceiling panels.

During February of 2015, our Police Department activity included:

- Six (6) Felony arrests, including:
 - A subject was arrested a residential Burglary *;
 - A subject was arrested for the Robbery of Cheviot News; and
 - A subject was arrested for Drug Trafficking and firearms offenses.
- Twenty-five (25) Misdemeanor arrests, which included:
 - Three juveniles, under the age of 9 (including an infant) left home alone;
 - A subject pointed a gun a woman and baby, threatening to kill them following a domestic argument;
 - Several arrests for drug possession; and
 - Multiple subjects arrested for Magistrate Court warrants.
- Twenty-nine (29) Traffic charges, including:
 - Six (6) arrests for Driving Under Suspension; and
 - Nine (9) cited for Speeding.
- Fourteen (14) arrests of subjects who had outstanding warrants from other Jurisdictions.

Cases of note (*):

- A subject was arrested after collected evidence showed that he had broken out a rear window of a home, while the owner was away.
- A subject was involved in a “shots fired” on the lot of a local business. Officer Dietrich spotted the fleeing vehicle and, after a brief traffic pursuit, the subject was arrested with several drug bindles. He had hidden two firearms near the business, and both were recovered by officers.

During March of 2015, our Police Department activity included:

- Five (5) Felony arrests, including:
 - A subject was arrested for Robbery of a cell phone*;
 - A subject was arrested for firearms charges following a bar fight; and
 - A subject was arrested for Robbery after stealing prescription drugs from a subject at gunpoint*.
- Twenty-five (25) Misdemeanor arrests, which included:
 - A subject threatened the manager of the store (where she worked), and dumped trash on the manager's car;
 - Arrests made from Domestic-related charges;
 - Several arrests for drug possession; and
 - Multiple subjects arrested for Magistrate Court warrants.
- Thirty-four (34) Traffic charges, including:
 - Eleven (11) arrests for Driving Under Suspension; and
 - Ten (10) cited for Speeding.
- Twenty-six (26) arrests of subjects who had outstanding warrants from other Jurisdictions.

Cases of note (*):

- A subject brandished a revolver to steal a cell phone from a juvenile. He was arrested when the victim saw him at a store the next day.
- After having been parked in front of a resident's home, a subject confronted the resident with a firearm when that resident returned home from the drug store.

Re: Police Department Activity Report

During April of 2015, our Police Department activity included:

- Four (4) Felony arrests, including:
 - A subject was arrested on Drug Trafficking charges*;
 - A subject was arrested for having broken into a bar (following an investigation); and
 - Upon stopping a vehicle with a known wanted Felon, that subject was found to be in possession of a loaded firearm*.
- Thirty-four (34) Misdemeanor arrests, which included:
 - An intoxicated subject was arrested after banging on the rear door of a stranger's home*;
 - A subject was arrested for Possession of Criminal Tools*;
 - Several arrests for drug possession; and
 - Multiple subjects arrested for Magistrate Court warrants.
- Forty-three (43) Traffic charges, including:
 - Two (2) arrests for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence;
 - Thirteen (13) arrests for Driving Under Suspension; and
 - Sixteen (16) cited for Speeding.
- Twenty (20) arrests of subjects who had outstanding warrants from other Jurisdictions, including one Felony.

Cases of note (*):

- **Officer Dietrich & Sergeant Stone** located a subject they had been looking for on outstanding warrants. He lied about his identity, and was found to be in possession of several drugs packaged for sale. The drugs included Heroin, five baggies of prescription pills, and Marijuana.
- A subject continued to bang on a resident's rear door, breaking the glass. The resident told her to leave repeatedly, but she continued, claiming that she lived there. She did not.
- **Officer Goff** arrested a subject was arrested in possession of tin snips, in an area that has experienced numerous A/C thefts.

During May of 2015, our Police Department activity included:

- Eight (8) Felony arrests, including:
 - A subject was found to be in possession of cocaine & marijuana after being involved in a vehicle collision;
 - A subject was arrested for drug abuse, after having run off the road following his injected Heroin; and
 - Several subjects were arrested out of a stolen car.
- Thirty-three (33) Misdemeanor arrests, which included:
 - A subject was arrested for Child Endangering*;
 - Several arrests for drug possession; and
 - Multiple subjects arrested for Magistrate Court warrants.
- Forty-five (45) Traffic charges, including:
 - Three (3) arrests for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence;
 - Six (6) arrests for Driving Under Suspension; and
 - Ten (10) cited for Speeding.
- Twenty-four (24) arrests of subjects who had outstanding warrants from other Jurisdictions, including five on Felonies.

Cases of note (*):

- Two subjects were passed out in a car on a parking lot, reportedly after ingesting Heroin. An infant was in the back seat sweating & crying. The driver was arrested for Child Endangering (the Heroin evidence was not able to be located). Children's Services took custody of the baby.
