- Water one gallon per person, per day, for three days
- Non-perishable food (three day supply)
- NOAA Weather Radio
- Flashlight
- First aid kit
- Whistle
- Dust mask
- Moist towelettes
- Wrench to turn off utilities
- Non-electric can opener
- Local maps
- Three-day supply of medication
- Baby supplies
- Pet supplies
- Personal documents
- Emergency contact information

SIGN UP FOR ALERT HAMILTON COUNTY & SMART911

Do you have multiple ways to receive alerts and warnings? It is recommended to have at least two ways to learn about severe weather and other emergencies. With Alert Hamilton County, you can sign up for up to 42 weather & emergency alerts, AND you can decide how you wish to receive those alerts (Text, Voice, Phone Call).

Alert Hamilton County has a bonus feature of being paired with Smart911, allowing you to fill out a "Safety Profile" that enables you to send important family, medical, and contact information to 9–1–1 dispatchers during an emergency. This revolutionary system even allows you to include pictures of your family members & pets!

There are five simple steps to register to Alert Hamilton County & Smart911:

- 1. Log on to www.alerthc.org.
- 2. Register your address and contact information.
- 3. Select alerts you wish to receive.
- 4. Select how you would like to receive alerts and notifications (text, email, cell phone, home phone, work phone).
- 5. Create your safe and secure Smart911 Safety Profile.
