Meeting was called to order at 7:45 pm with Nick Hayden expressing that he has an issue with the Metro Buses speeding on Robb Ave.

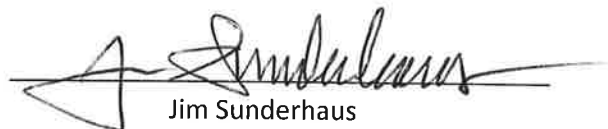

Meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm.



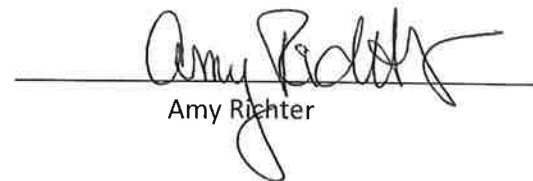

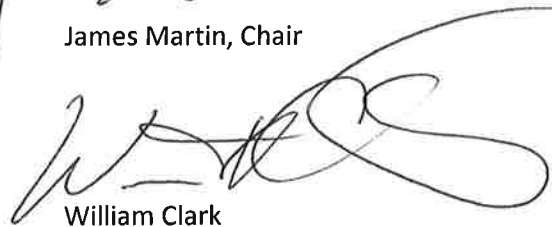

### **Build on Existing Businesses**

- Worked with local bar owner about façade renovations

### **Marketing**

- Met with Michael Stephens at Mercy Hospital about partnering opportunities with Cheviot
- Updated available commercial properties list

### **Recruit New Businesses**

- Met with business owner interested in relocating from Green Twp. to Cheviot
- Worked with local business owner to provide updated commercial availability for potential relocating businesses to Cheviot.

### **City Improvements/Grants**

- Worked with Tom Braun on fitness station selection
- Finalized grant approval from Jerry Statuberg Memorial Fund, CWCA, and Cheviot Savings bank for \$10,500 grant contingent on approval of grant request from Ohio NatureWorks – this would serve as the 25% local matching funds.
- Prepared plans for renovation of Pioneer Park
- Worked on Interact for Health grant update/modification
