A Message from Mayor Samuel D. Keller

Harvest Home Pool is going through some much needed renovations. Contractors are repairing concrete around the pool deck, in the baby pool and in the main pool. We are installing a new pool motor/pump as well. We will be re-caulking and painting both the main pool and the baby pool. New lifeguard chairs are going up and we have purchased a pool cover. All these repairs are funded by the Community Development Block Grant Fund to the tune of \$60,000.00. With all of these improvements being made, a pool pass would make a great Christmas Gift for you, your family or a family member. You can purchase your membership at City Hall weekdays from 8 am to 4 pm. Family passes are \$10.00 off and single is \$5.00 off if purchased before May 30, 2016.

In an effort to combat the heroin epidemic and its effects on our City, we have joined the **Regional Enforcement Narcotics Unit (RENU)** headed by the Hamilton Co. Sheriff's office under the direction of HC Sheriff Jim Neil, and we now have a Full-Time Cheviot Police Officer dedicated to Drug Enforcement. Our officer, along with officers from other cities, townships and Hamilton Co. make up this unit. The purpose of RENU investigations is to disrupt activities of those individuals and organizations primarily responsible for the distribution of controlled substances into and within the City of Cheviot and the Hamilton Co. region and the violence associated with this activity. This will be accomplished through identification, arrest and prosecution of those responsible, seizure of controlled substances, and seizure and forfeiture of assets used in and derived from illegal distribution of controlled substances. Cheviot Maintains Fiscal Stability

I'd like to start by recognizing Cheviot for having yet another perfect State audit. It's testament to the dedication of the financial offices. Year to date we have 5 JEDDs (Joint Economic Development Districts), 4 with Green Township and 1 with Colerain Township. A JEDD is an arrangement between a township and a municipality in Ohio whereby they work together to develop township land for commercial or industrial purposes. The benefit to the municipality is they get a portion of the earnings taxes levied in the JEDD. Revenues from the JEDDs along with the garbage fee and updated levies have helped Cheviot recover from reduced State funding. I would now describe Cheviot's financial future as PROMISING, IMPROVING, PROGRESSING, and EVOLVING.

Within the last two years, Cheviot has been able to fund the following:

- Our fire dept. got back on schedule by replacing a 27 year-old fire truck and 15 year-old service vehicle
- Our maintenance dept. was able to purchase a much needed garbage truck and dump truck
- Our police Dept. was able to receive two new cruisers and a used canine car

Cheviot’s Vision 2020

The Vision 2020 Task Force was formed in the spring to develop a comprehensive strategic plan that provides a “big picture” framework and unifying vision for Cheviot’s growth and development for the next 5 years. It will set forth a bold vision for the future unique to our small city by providing a set of innovative, transformative strategies that chart the course for achieving the vision and outlining clear implementation actions to ensure that these ideas become reality in the coming years. The Task Force has identified several areas of opportunity that were shared at recent public hearings. The group will now prioritize and strategize, and then bring it back to the public in the spring for comments. Details will be provided in the next newsletter.

Notes from Cheviot Public School

Cheviot is entering it’s first year as an official Leader in Me school. The program provides a process to help schools proactively design the culture that reflects their vision of the ideal school. Content from *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People* is a key component of the program. The school is now partnered with Greater Cincinnati YMCA to offer quality childcare enrichment services before and after school. A free Y Literacy Lab is offered for struggling readers in small group tutoring sessions. Cheviot School Choir will sing at the Cheviot Nativity Scene and will have a Snow Show performance Jan. 28, 2016.
